What belongs in a summary?	What doesn't belong in a summary?	
<ul> <li>the title and author</li> <li>the author's purpose</li> <li>the author's central idea</li> <li>how the author supports that idea (describing personal experience, providing facts, making a comparison, telling an anecdote, etc.)</li> <li>the key ideas and reasoning that support the central idea</li> <li>the author's concluding point</li> <li>the author's ideas in your words</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>minor details</li> <li>your opinion</li> <li>sentences copied from the text</li> </ul>	

## Reporting Verbs that can help you state an author's ideas:

- 5. What **point** does the author make in the conclusion?

## Formulaic Summary

In(title), (author's name)(purpose)(topic) He/she states that			
(central idea) (Author's name) supports this idea			
by(writing strategy/ types of details) She/he (reporting verb)(first key idea) He/she			
then (reporting verb)(second key idea) (Author's name) concludes by (reporting verb) that			
(concluding point)
