- **Residents: \$46 per unit**
 - U.S. Citizens
 - Permanent Residents
 - AB 540 students
 - Immigration process with an I-130 or an I-485 form
 - Seasonal Agricultural workers
 - **Nonresidents (International students & Nonresidents)**
 - \$327 per unit + \$46 per unit= **\$373**
 - **Other costs to consider:**
 - Parking
 - Health fee
 - Textbooks
 - Materials fees
- *Six units or less = \$46

- Students will need to know their H number.

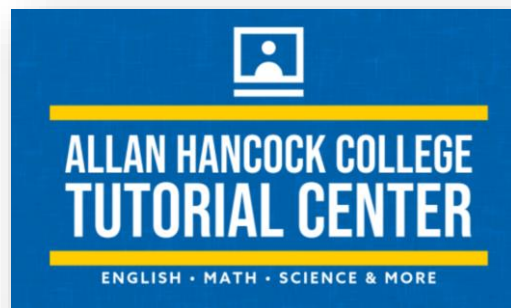

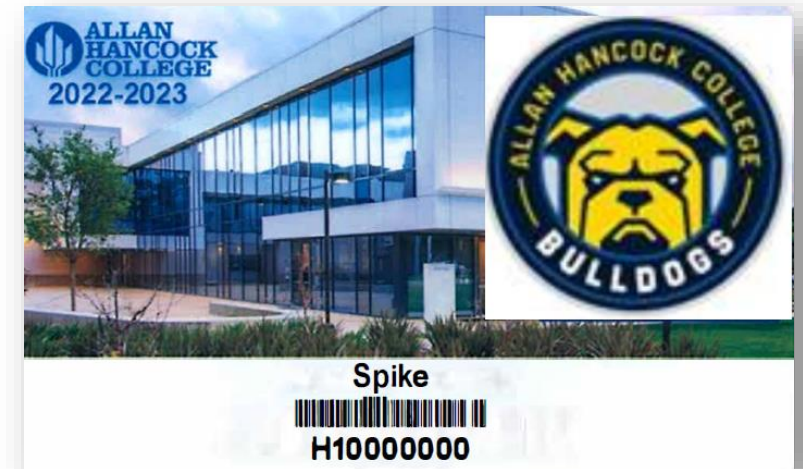
