<b>WELL</b>	<b>WE'LL</b>	<b>WILL</b>
<i>Well</i> means two things—first, “a hole in the ground for getting water or oil,” or “an oil well.” It also means “good” or “O.K.” <i>Well</i> rhymes with <i>bell</i> and <i>tell</i> .	<i>We'll</i> is a contraction of two words: we will. <i>We'll</i> is pronounced exactly like <i>wheel</i> . It rhymes with <i>feel</i> and <i>deal</i> .	<i>Will</i> has two meanings. First, it is the verb to indicate the future tense. Second, it may mean one's desire or intention, as in willpower. <i>Will</i> rhymes with <i>bill</i> , <i>still</i> , and <i>kill</i> .

WERE	WE'RE	WHERE
<i>Were</i> is the past tense of <i>are</i> : <b>Were</b> you on time for class? It rhymes with <i>stir, blur, and fur</i> .	<b>We're</b> is a contraction of two words: <i>we are</i> . It is pronounced exactly like <i>weird</i> , except that it doesn't end with a <i>d</i> sound. It rhymes with <i>clear</i> and <i>fear</i> .	<b>Where</b> means "at a certain place." <b>Where</b> rhymes with <i>there, care, and chair</i> .
