### **Pandemic H1N1 Vaccine Clinics for Pregnant Women Only**

The Public Health Department has scheduled H1N1 vaccine clinics for pregnant women who have not obtained H1N1 vaccine through their obstetricians. Children and young adults with substantial, physically disabling conditions will be receiving H1N1 vaccine through their healthcare providers.

Obstetricians will be receiving vaccine and providing the H1N1 vaccine for their pregnant patients. The Public Health Department is providing vaccination clinics for those pregnant women who do not receive vaccine from their healthcare providers.

#### **PHD H1N1 Vaccination Clinic for PREGNANT WOMEN only**

- Lompoc Clinic: Thursday, October 29<sup>th</sup>, 3:00 to 7:00 P.M. 301 North R Street
- Santa Maria Clinic: Wednesday, October 28<sup>th</sup>, 1:00 to 7:00 P.M. 2115 Centerpointe Parkway
- Franklin Clinic (Santa Barbara): Wednesday, October 28<sup>th</sup>, 3:00 to 7:00 P.M. 1136 E. Montecito St.

Children & young adults (6 months to 24 years of age) with substantial, physically disabling conditions that affect their respiratory and immune systems are also one of the high risk groups. This includes individuals with conditions such as cystic fibrosis, cerebral palsy, a disease requiring the use of immunosuppressive medications, type 1 diabetes and significant residual lung disease resulting from premature birth. Children and young adults with these conditions will be contacted by their healthcare providers who will provide the vaccine. **There are no separate clinics for children and young adults at this time.**
