Allan Hancock College is a public community college serving a 3,000 square mile area on the Central Coast of California.

The college offers degrees and certificates in more than 100 areas of study in 12 academic departments. Credit enrollment is more than 11,000 students per semester.

The one-college district has campuses in Santa Maria, Lompoc, Vandenberg Air Force Base and Solvang. The Santa Maria campus consists of 105.6 acres, including 9.6 acres at South Campus.

The Lompoc Valley Center is a 54,442 square-foot, multimillion-dollar facility offering students state-of-the-art instruction. It is located on 156 scenic acres at the north end of Lompoc.
