# Fast Track

## Short on time? Take a Fast Track class!

Fast Track classes meet eight weeks or less—most are only one or two days (and weekends, too!). These classes are for students who want to complete classes at a faster rate with concentrated instruction.

Eight-week term courses are also part of our Fast Track program and are listed on pages 44–45. Term classes offer the credit of semester-length classes in eight weeks of instruction. Unlike other Fast Track classes which are scheduled throughout the semester and offer the opportunity to register up the first day of class (space permitting), eight-week Term classes have specific registration deadlines. Please note those registration deadlines on the spring calendar on page 4.

### How to Register for Fast Track Classes

You may register for a Fast Track class up to the first day of class at any campus location, space permitting. To ensure priority enrollment, Fast Track enrollees are encouraged to use WebReg, mail-in registration, or walk-through registration by appointment. Some classes may fill before the start date, please call 922-6966/ toll free 1-866-DIAL AHC (342-5242) ext. 3248 for space availability.

- The enrollment fee is \$26 per unit (\$13 per half-unit). Other fees may apply. See page 8 for complete fee listing.
- To accommodate Fast Track enrollment, the Santa Maria Admissions and Records office and the cashier's office are open Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Registration is also available at our three off-campus centers. See page 2 for their office hours.
- A course description of each Fast Track class is included in the course listing beginning on page 60 of this schedule.
- For more information about Fast Track classes in accounting, business, computers, office automation, computer business information systems and management, call Bob Bryant at ext. 3426. All other Fast Track course/registration questions should be directed to the Admissions and Records office at ext. 3248.
- Dropping a Fast Track class is the responsibility of the student. Fast Track classes must be dropped prior to the first class meeting for a refund and no grade penalty.

# Distance Learning Classes Internet • Video/DVD/TV • Live Video Link

**Distance learning offers you** the opportunity to earn college credits through self-paced learning that offers maximum flexibility. Some distance learning classes require no on-site activities; others do have required on-site attendance. Please be aware that the college does not provide hardware or software for home use. Check with your instructor to determine specific equipment needs. You should check the information provided in the orientation sections of the distance learning pages for full details.

students enrolled in distance learning courses usually attend an orientation session where they will receive information regarding course requirements, examination schedules, instructor conferences, and review sessions. The dates and locations of orientation sessions are listed by each course. If a student registers after the orientation session, he or she must contact the instructor immediately. Faculty phone numbers are listed on page 40 of this schedule and email addresses are provided in the orientation section, when available. Email addresses change frequently. If a message to the email address shown is returned to you, please refer to the faculty directory for a current telephone number, or, check the district's Web site at [www.hancockcollege.edu](http://www.hancockcollege.edu), click people/directory for email addresses.

Those registered students who choose to withdraw from class must follow withdrawal procedures if they do not wish to receive a failing grade (see page 18). For information about any of the procedures listed above, call ext. 3320 or 3475.

**You must have an email account to participate in distance learning classes.**

Students enrolling in distance learning courses may register via WebReg, mail-in or walk-through registration by the established deadlines. All fees listed on page 8 are applicable to distance learning classes except the Student Center Fee. (**Note:** Students enrolling in live video link classes based in Santa Maria are required to pay the Student Center Fee.) After registering,

The enrollment size of each online class is limited to the same size as an on-campus class. This ensures that the quality of the teacher-student interaction is maintained.

**Register early! Many classes are filled well in advance of the registration deadline.**

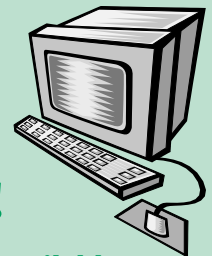

*Students often wonder if they have the computer skills to take a distance learning class. Recommended computer skills include, but are not limited to, the ability to:*

- Use a browser (Internet Explorer, Netscape)
- Use word processing software (Microsoft Word, Works, or Word Perfect)
- Use email, including sending email attachments
- Perform basic file management
- Find information on the Internet (or searching the Internet)
- Complete online forms
- Download and use plug-ins

**You are well on your way to success in distance education if you are self-motivated, communicate effectively through reading and writing, can type, have access to a computer and the Internet, and have an email account.**

As always, contact your instructor directly if you have questions. Instructor email addresses are listed in the 'orientations' column of these listings.

## Your personal security as a distance learning student

Allan Hancock College does not restrict enrollment in distance learning classes any more than it does in on-site classes. The law requires that we admit all qualified students. We encourage you to exercise the same kind of caution in a distance learning class as you would if you were taking an on-site class. Do not share personal information about yourself; do not give a relative stranger or new acquaintance your home phone number or address. Additional advice about maintaining your personal security while enrolled in a distance learning class will be provided during your class orientation.

### Recommended minimums for equipment and browsers:

**Pentium II, 64 megabytes RAM, 56 K modem, and sound card**  
"Blackboard" works most efficiently with Internet Explorer versions 4.0 and up and will work with Netscape 4.0 and higher. Macintosh owners may not be able to make use of all capabilities of "Blackboard"; certain math courses are not accessible from Macintosh computers. Students with America Online accounts may need to obtain another email provider. In some circumstances, AOL considers emails sent through Blackboard to be spam and blocks the messages. Contact your instructor for more information. Successfully downloading some class materials may require a high speed Internet connection. If you are experiencing extremely slow download times for class materials, please check with your instructor.

"Blackboard" is the mechanism used by most instructors for instructional activities. Students must have direct, personal access to the Internet and an email account. The expectation is that the students use the computer themselves and do not work through an intermediary, except in the case of students with physical disabilities. Computers are available at both the Santa Maria campus and Lompoc Valley Center on a first-come, first-served basis. To access class pages via Blackboard, students may point their browsers to <http://hancock-online.net> or go to the AHC home page at <http://www.hancockcollege.edu> and click on Blackboard. Instructors will provide more information concerning access to Blackboard, such as login name and password, at orientations.

## Course Numbering System

Courses numbered **100-199** are baccalaureate-level courses and will transfer to the California State University system and other four-year institutions. Please note that some of these courses would not be appropriate for specific majors or for the general education requirements for graduation.

Courses numbered **300-399** are intended for certificate and associate degree programs. In some cases, with special arrangements, they may be acceptable for transfer to some four-year universities.

Courses numbered **400-499** are primarily vocational credit courses that are not applicable to the associate degree programs and do not transfer to four-year institutions.

Courses numbered **500-599** are college preparatory in nature and are not applicable to the associate degree programs and do not transfer to four-year institutions.

**Internships (134/136):** These courses are discipline specific, work-based learning opportunities for students capable of independent work and who demonstrate the desire for additional study beyond the classroom.

**Cooperative Education Courses (149):** The Occupational Work Experience course provides on-the-job learning related to a student's educational or occupational goals, and is offered by numerous disciplines. See "Cooperative Education" in the listing of classes for a more complete description.

**Institutes (159, 359, 459):** These courses are primarily technical, vocational skill building curriculum developed in specific disciplines.

**Independent Projects (188/189/389):** These courses are academic opportunities for students who are capable of independent work and who demonstrate the need or desire for additional study beyond the regular curriculum.

All contracts for independent projects classes must be completed and submitted to a late registration site by 6 p.m. Thursday, February 2, 2006.

**Topics In (199/399/499/599):** These courses identify curriculum in specific disciplines which is not offered on a regular cycle (not within a two-year period). These courses are not included in any major core, but may be among the selected or elective units of a program.
