INDEPENDENT VS DEPENDENT STUDENTS

INDEPENDENT STUDENT

If the student was able to answer YES to ANY of the below questions, then the student may be considered an independent student. Student may not be required to provide parental information on the FAFSA or Dream Act Application.

DEPENDENT STUDENT

If the student answered NO to ALL of the side questions, then the student may be considered a dependent student and may be required to provide his/her parents' marital status, demographic data and financial information when completing the FAFSA or Dream Act Application.

INDEPENDENT STUDENT

If you answer **YES** to ANY of these questions, then you may be an independent student. You may not be required to provide parental information on your *Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)* form.

DEPENDENT STUDENT*

If you answer **NO** to ALL of these questions, then you may be considered a dependent student and may be required to provide your parents' financial information when completing the FAFSA form.

- 1 Will you be 24 or older by Jan. 1 of the school year for which you are applying for financial aid? For example, if you plan to start school in August 2021 for the 2021–22 school year, will you be 24 by Jan. 1, 2021 (i.e., were you born before Jan. 1, 1998)?
- 2 Are you married or separated but not divorced?
- 3 Will you be working toward a master's or doctorate degree (such as M.A., MBA, M.D., J.D., Ph.D., Ed.D., etc.)?
- 4 Do you have children who receive more than half of their support from you?
- 5 Do you have dependents (other than children or a spouse) who live with you and receive more than half of their support from you?
- 6 Are you currently serving on active duty in the U.S. armed forces for purposes other than training?
- 7 Are you a veteran of the U.S. armed forces?
- 8 At any time since you turned age 13, were both of your parents deceased, were you in foster care, or were you a ward or dependent of the court?
- 9 Are you an emancipated minor or are you in a legal guardianship as determined by a court?
- 10 Are you an unaccompanied youth who is homeless or self-supporting and at risk of being homeless?

**If you don't answer "yes" to any of the questions above, you're still considered a dependent student for purposes of applying for federal student aid even if you don't live with your parents, are not claimed by your parents on their tax forms, or are paying for your own bills and educational expenses.*



Federal & State Financial Aid

Federal Funding

- **2021-22 Pell Grant** (max- **\$6,495** for the full-time students)
 - Pell Grant amounts are prorated based on enrollment-
- Federal **Supplemental Opportunity Grant-\$400 to \$500**
- Federal Work Study (enrolled in 6 units, SAP)
- **Student Loans**
 - (fixed interest rates for loans disbursed on or after July 1, 2021)
 - Direct Subsidized Loan (3.73%)
 - **Direct Unsubsidized Loan (3.73%)**
 - **Direct PLUS Loans (6.28%)**



Grants and work study do not require repayment as long as you meet minimum satisfactory academic program standards. Student Loans have to be paid in 10 years, 6 months after you drop to less than 6 units or after graduate from college.

State Funding

- **California College Promise Grant (CCPG):**

Pays enrollment fees at California Community Colleges (\$46/unit)

- **Chafee Grant:** Foster youth with financial need students may qualify for up to \$5,000.

The Commission will be implementing a self-certification process for the students and institutions are required to resolve any conflicting information regarding student eligibility prior to disbursing payments.

PROMISE PLUS PROGRAM CRITERIA:

- Apply for admission
- Must complete and have a valid FAFSA or CDAA submitted to AHC by **September 10, 2021** (priority filing date); be flexible with weekly FAFSA/CDAA's being submitted
- Fall/spring must enroll in a minimum of **12 units of which 1 in-person(face-to-face)** section must be taken any one of our district locations. This award is in effect the 2021-2022 year which **does include summer 2021**, Fall 2021 Intersession 2022 (NO unit limit); and Spring 2022
- **PROMISE PLUS COVERS** (enrollment fees, health fee, student center fees)

Veterans Access Choice and Accountability Act (VACA)

Students who have a residency status of "Out of State Resident" are eligible for a California Non-Resident Tuition Exemption if:

- The student is physically present in California
- It is within 3 years of the military member's discharge date

- Spouse/child of eligible member who has transferred benefits

- Typical deadline: **February 10, 2021.**

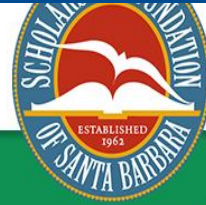


Most scholarships require that the student enroll in and complete the fall 2021 AND spring 2022 semesters with at least 6.0 units each semester and maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.00 or higher.

Fire Academy or EMS Academy scholarships. The student must be enrolled in the Allan Hancock College Fire Academy or EMS Academy for fall 2021 or spring 2022 **AND** graduate from the academy successfully. Students who have a bachelor's degree **ARE** eligible to apply for Fire Academy or EMS Academy scholarships.

Industrial Technology (IT) scholarships. The student must successfully complete one IT course in the fall 2021 with a GPA of 2.00 or higher **AND** complete one IT course in the spring 2022 with a GPA of 2.00.

Joe Prandini Memorial Scholarship offered by Bonipak Produce, Inc. This scholarship is open only to Betteravia Farms, Bonita Packing or Oceano Farming employees or dependents of employees. The applicant must have a 2.00 GPA and attend Allan Hancock College in the fall of 2021. *Please note, if you are a graduating high school senior (June 2020) and planning to attend Allan Hancock College next fall, complete the online scholarship application. Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) Standards

A. FEDERAL: To become eligible to receive Federal financial aid (**Pell Grant, Federal Supplemental Opportunity Grant, Federal Work Study**) students must adhere to the following requirements:

1. Maintain an Allan Hancock College cumulative GPA of **2.0** or above.
2. Complete **67%** of the total number of units attempted cumulatively, if aid was ever received or not.
3. Complete your educational program within the maximum timeframe (**150%**) of the published program's required units at Allan Hancock College. **90 attempted units** for a 60-unit program.

B. STATE: To become eligible to receive State financial aid students must adhere to the following requirements:

1. Maintain an Allan Hancock College cumulative GPA of **2.0** or above.
