- Since launching Summer 2022, there has been 2 cohorts

Alyssa - Learning Aligned Employment Program (LAEP)

- There has been the 1st student that has been placed with the SM Chamber of Commerce
- Employers who have the ability to offer them a full time position after their studies
- It subsidizes costs of student wages to approved employers, up to 90%
- Supports underrepresented students
- Student has Half-time, SAP
- There are 7 positions currently posted on JobSpeaker
- We are always looking to seek new employers to offer a more diverse work field

- There has been 244 sections added
- At 10 local high schools
- 41 different courses
- 59 faculty with 10 of those new
