Frances and Stephanie are working to get a parent information night and campus visit together for high school students coming to Hancock. We should be able to get students registered and set up their disability services at these events. We want to make sure students know what we offer and how we can continue those support services and do some bridging.

Margaret oversees our career, workforce programming, and health sciences. There are on the job training opportunities, both through Strong Workforce and through Goodwill.

Margaret is one of the Deans of Academic Affairs. She oversees directly the Industrial Technology Program, Health Sciences Program, and Apprenticeship Programs. She is also the defacto CTE Dean. She also oversees the two most significant pots of funding support for career and technical education. One is federal Perkins dollars; the other is Strong Workforce Program. Both support career and technical education including reaching out to special populations.

Hancock has well over 40 disciplines as part of the CTE Programs. We have a number of our programs that are waiting approval with ETPL (Eligible Training Provider List).

Some College Now classes are available in the CTE programs. Most of them are in the evenings outside of the bell schedule. A lot of these courses don't have any prerequisites. The keyboarding class that is now being offered to middle school under concurrent enrollment. This is a CTE course.

All concurrent enrollment classes are College Now classes, but the reverse is not necessarily true. Here is the link to the list of College Now classes:
