 - Growth mindset + goal setting** to be applied within Embedded Counseling
 - How do we address equity in grading?** (looking at timing of quizzes, look at passing trends based off ethnicity, looking at how many students drop based off timing of assignments and quizzes) (before or after census, etc.)
 - Student expectations differ from that of instructor
 - Sharing syllabus and procedures needs to be conducted multiple times** throughout semester, many students need to struggle before they realize they need to abide by specific class protocols
 - Using Canvas gradebook consistently and early in semester** helps students stay on track
 - Could create Growth Mindset-based assignment that encourages and normalizes students looking at their grade on Canvas (could be separate from final grade)
 - Could also create low point/extra credit Syllabus quiz
