### ٧. **Curriculum – Other (action)**

Title 5 (55063) GE and Competency Requirements (AHC GE Category 4B) MATH 309 and Math Competency Graduation Requirement

"Effective for all students admitted to a community college for the Fall 2009 term or any term thereafter, competence in mathematics shall be demonstrated by obtaining a satisfactory grade in a mathematics course at the level of the course typically known as Intermediate Algebra (either Intermediate Algebra or another mathematics course at the same level, with the same rigor and with Elementary Algebra as a prerequisite, approved locally) or by completing an assessment conducted pursuant to subchapter 6 of this chapter (commencing with section 55500) and achieving a score determined to be comparable to satisfactory completion of the specified mathematics course. Satisfactory completion of a mathematics course at the level of Intermediate Algebra shall satisfy both this competency requirement and the coursework requirement set forth in subdivision (b)(1)(D)(ii) of this section". 5CCR 55063

- Math 309 is comprised of both Math 311, Algebra I (Elementary Algebra) and Math 331, Algebra II (Intermediate Algebra).
- The course does not list the required elementary algebra course as a prerequisite.
- This course is "at the level" of intermediate algebra and has elementary algebra built in. Rather than removing content, the design of the course minimizes the amount of time spent on those topics which prepare students for calculus. More time is spent on content that prepares students for statistics such as linear modeling and exponentials.
- This course is designed for non-stem majors and will provide students with the math they need and use in everyday situations.
- This course will be a prerequisite for Math 123, Statistics and Math 100, Nature of Math
- STEM majors should not take this course.
- Will this course meet the nursing prerequisite as Math 331 does? Follow-up will be done by Larry Manalo.
- AP&P Committee statement: The committee encourages the creation of innovative and alternative courses to meet the needs of students and is committed to ensuring quality and compliant courses. Based on the content of Math 309, in which the required prerequisite of Elementary Algebra is incorporated into the course, the committee recommends that the graduation requirements be amended to include Math 309:

### COMPETENCY IN READING, IN WRITTEN EXPRESSION, AND IN MATHEMATICS has been demonstrated.

Students will demonstrate competence in reading by completing the general education requirements (below).

Students will demonstrate competence in written expression by completing English 100 (grade C or higher) or English 101 (grade C or higher).

**NOTE:** Students who plan to transfer to a four-year institution should demonstrate competence in written expression by completing English 101 rather than English 100.

Students will demonstrate competence in mathematics by meeting any one of the following standards:

- A. Pass one of the following courses with a C or better: Math 309, Math 321, Math 331, Math 333/334, or any 100-level math course of at least three units.
- B. Receive a math placement recommendation for any 100-level math course based on the current Allan Hancock START process.

### **Summary Report**

Fashion Studies Certificate of Accomplishment Discussion

- The program was previously listed in the catalog as an AS degree and certificate of achievement.
- Effective with the 15-16 catalog, the program units went from 19 units to 17 units due to FCS 140 AB course listed incorrectly as 4 units. The course should have been listed as a non-repeatable course of 2 units: FCS 140, 2 units.
- The fashion studies program could not be listed as an associate degree or certificate of achievement because such programs are required to be at least 18 or more units. Listing the program as a degree program of 17 units is not compliant with Title 5 regulations.
- The program is currently listed as a certificate of accomplishment which does not require state submission for approval. There was no modification submitted for this catalog change.
- Per a 9/17/15 meeting the applied behavioral sciences department will submit modifications (split FCS
  140AB into two courses) so that the original intent of the program is maintained. However, the program is
  currently taught by part-time faculty who is currently on leave.
- The department wishes to have the original program award designation (degree/certificate of achievement) re-established in a 15-16 catalog addendum so the program is aligned with the state inventory of programs. Listing the "recommended electives" as "selected units and requiring 2 units" would bring the program back to 19 units and maintain its degree status and provide some time to prepare proposals to modify FCS 140 appropriately.
- The committee recognizes that the program modification process has not been used and the modification to the change the language in the Fashion Studies program (elective units to selected units) cannot be implemented until a proposal is submitted.
- COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS for FASHION STUDIES: instead of changing the elective courses
  to selected units (selected units means the units are included in the total program units) move FCS 131
  from recommended electives to the required core courses or, add a business course to required core
  courses; submit the necessary course and program modification proposals.
- COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS for SUMMARY REPORT: include the effective date/term for new and modified curriculum.

A handout showing the formula calculating hours to units was distributed. The Chancellor's Office Hours to Units conversion chart was also distributed. The following was presented:

- Chancellor's Office instructions state that the course outline of record is to include a single term length multiplier used for calculating units (currently, the term length used on the course outline of record is a range of 16-18 weeks).
- The Chancellor's Office recommends that college's use the 18 week term to calculate units (Program and Course Approval Handbook, 2013, pages 80-83).
- The academic affairs office is currently reviewing and comparing how using a 17 or 18 week term to calculate units/hours will impact scheduling hours and current unit calculations.
- Preliminary reports from CurricUnet have identified some errors in the current calculations where
  "calculations overridden" have been used. In most of these cases, the errors are a result of entering
  incorrect weekly hours for courses that are less than, or more than 16 weeks. These are being corrected
  by entering the correct number of weekly hours based on 16-weeks and the overridden option is being
  changed to allow the system (CurricUnet) to calculate the correct number of units.
- A second report will be more accurate and a specific term length multiplier (16, 17, or 18 week) can then
  be considered. Depending on the term to be used, a proposal to modify course hours or course units may
  be needed where corrections cannot be made (unit changes, total contact hours, total lecture or total lab
  hours).

Imagine that a course requires 72 hours of lecture, 54 hours of laboratory, and 144 hours of homework. Then the total number of units would be:

# BACKGROUND:

The curriculum report for the period August 27 - September 24, 2015 is attached for consideration of the board of trustees. This report includes a summary of new and modified courses and programs being recommended for adoption.

# FISCAL IMPACT:

New courses will be supported based on current budget allowances within the disciplines/departments either by reallocation of existing funds or cycling existing offerings to allow for the offering of new curriculum. Additionally, full-time faculty receives a stipend of \$250 per new course developed and \$150 per major course modification.

# RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the board of trustees adopt the curriculum additions and changes reflected in the summary report of the Academic Policy and Planning Committee for the period.

# MISCELLANEOUS Effective: 2016-17

The committee Academic Policy and Planning Committee encourages the creation of innovative and alternative courses to meet the needs of students and is committed to ensuring quality and compliant courses. The content of Math 309, Algebra and Math Literacy, already incorporates the required prerequisite of Elementary Algebra. Therefore, the committee recommends that the graduation requirements for competency in mathematics be amended to include Math 309:

#### COMPETENCY IN READING, IN WRITTEN EXPRESSION, AND IN MATHEMATICS has been demonstrated.

- Students will demonstrate competence in reading by completing the general education requirements (below).
- Students will demonstrate competence in written expression by completing English 100 (grade C or higher) or English 101 (grade C or higher).

**NOTE:** Students who plan to transfer to a four-year institution should demonstrate competence in written expression by completing English 101 rather than English 100.

- Students will demonstrate competence in mathematics by meeting any one of the following standards:
  - a) Pass one of the following courses with a C or better: <u>Math 309</u>, Math 321, Math 331, Math 333/334, or any 100-level math course of at least three units.
  - Receive a math placement recommendation for any 100-level math course based on the current Allan Hancock START process.

- Attendance records must be forwarded to the dean's office at the conclusion of the semester for audit purposes.
- Audit findings from the last audit will be available soon.


