Simple homework assignment whereby students will practice the weekly photography theme which will gradually develop each student's personal portfolio. 2. Participate in interactive online peer review of weekly photography homework. 3. Complete one capstone photography project. Method of Evaluation: Expanded from Class participation to also include: 1. Ongoing evaluation of the weekly lab practice. 2. Interactive group discussion and peer review of weekly lab practice. 3. Instructor critique of weekly homework Added representational texts and materials. Updated student learning outcomes. The updated course is not designed for distance education.
