Background

Article V, Section 4, "Selection and Tenure," of the Auxiliary Programs Corporation Bylaws designates the college superintendent/president and chief financial officer as ex-officio voting directors of the corporation. The other three directors shall be selected as follows: one (1) academic administrator appointed by the superintendent/president; one (1) regular faculty member nominated by the Academic Senate and appointed by the superintendent/president; and one (1) student member nominated by the Associated Student Body Government and appointed by the superintendent/president. In addition, one (1) college trustee serves as a non-voting director.

• On a nomination from the Associated Student Body Government, the superintendent/president appoints Erica DeJesus to serve as the student member for the remainder of the academic year 2019-20.

4. Information Items

4.a. Financial Report for Auxiliary Programs

Keli Seyfert offered to respond to any questions about the income statement. Dr. Walthers shared that ASBG has requested additional funding for club activities. He has advised them to develop a plan and get some financial information from last year to compare with their request.

Andrea Sanders arrived at 3:37 p.m.

4.b. PCPA Volunteer Recognition

Jennifer Schwartz acknowledged the list of PCPA volunteers. Volunteers are recognized at the annual open house and at a separate spring gathering every other year for volunteer ushers. Dr. Walthers offered to give each of the volunteers a small token of appreciation.

4.c. Oral Reports

PCPA

Mark Booher reported PCPA has filled seven out of eight vacant positions since reporting the vacancies at the last meeting. PCPA is still seeking a development assistant.

PCPA is welcoming 12 technicians into the CTE program, 32 incoming actors, 16 professional interns, and a total of 101 students in the fall company. Mr. Booher noted they may add three additional students in the areas of carpentry, sound technician and wigs.

Mr. Booher reported auditions will begin for the InterPlay reading series and *The Little Mermaid* this week. He highlighted a few production details for *The Little Mermaid*.

Jennifer Schwartz referred to PCPA's financial statements and reviewed the fund balance. She noted the reports are not finalized as they are pending some adjustments, but PCPA is still expecting a surplus. She reported PCPA was over their financial goal for the season with *Peter Pan* and *Million Dollar Quartet* which helped make up for some shows that did not meet their goals.

Mr. Booher shared additional information about budget goal forecasting and ticket purchasing trends. Dr. Walthers added the fund balance includes *Mamma Mia* carryover sales and a large donor gift.

Trustee Hall asked if there was a committee that selects the shows for the PCPA season. Mr. Booher responded that there is a staff committee, not an external committee, for season selection.

ATHLETICS

Kim Ensing commented on the play *The Wolves* and said the recruiting event held in collaboration with the play was very successful. Ms. Ensing was able to add more perspective women's soccer players on the eligibility list from that event. She would like to plan another similar event with PCPA again in the future.

Ms. Ensing provided an update on the soccer and football teams. She announced they are planning a special Harlem Globetrotters event on February 13, 2020 and a golf tournament fundraiser.
