US HISTORY AND AMERICAN INSTITUTIONS REQUIREMENT

All CSU and UC campuses require completion of the US History and American Institutions requirement. CSU campuses require completion of a course in US-1 and US-2 (see course options below). UC campuses, except for UCSB, accept completion of a C- or better grade in high school of a one-year course in US History or a half-year course in US History and a half-year course in American Government. UCLA requires the completion of a B or better grade in the high school courses. UCSB requires students to complete a 3-unit college course. Consult a counselor for a list of approved courses. Courses may be used in Area 4.
