Allan Hancock *High School Enrichment!* Conditions for Enrollment 2026-2027

- 1. Principal Approval**

Before signing up, students must meet with their high school counselor or guidance staff. The high school principal or their designee must approve the classes. This approval shows the class is not offered at the high school.
- 2. Who Can Participate**

High School Enrichment and College and Career Access Pathways (CCAP) are open to high school students in all grade levels. Students enrolled through CCAP may take up to 15 college units per term, no exceptions. Students enrolled through High School Enrichment may take up to 11 college units per term. All students must maintain a minimum 2.0 cumulative college grade point average (GPA). If a student registers for any CCAP course, the student will be classified as a CCAP participant for that term and must follow all CCAP policies, procedures, and unit limits.
- 3. Applications and Registration**

Students must complete the Allan Hancock College online application. Students must also complete the DualEnroll online registration each term.
- 4. Approved Classes and Requirements**

Students may only register for classes approved by their high school principal or their designee. All course requirements must be met before enrolling. Requirements can be met by completing classes or an approved appeal.
- 5. Course Notes and Special Requirements**

Course requirements are listed in the college catalog or class schedule. An asterisk (*) next to a class means there is a requirement. A star symbol means the class requires an audition.
- 6. Home School Students**

Home school students must submit a current private school affidavit on file with the California Department of Education.
- 7. Physical Education Classes**

PE activity classes require instructor permission. Permission may be given on the first day of class if space is available.
- 8. College Transcript**

All grades and units earned will appear on the student's official college transcript. This record is permanent.
- 9. Fees**

There are no fees for CCAP students. High School Enrichment students get their enrollment fee waived, while other fees still apply, such as health, parking, student center, and materials fees. Nonresident fees are not charged. Unpaid fees will result in a registration hold. If approved to take 12 or more units as a High School Enrichment student, all fees must be paid and are no longer waived. If a student registers for any CCAP class, they will be considered CCAP and will follow CCAP guidelines.
- 10. Student Rights and Responsibilities**

High School Enrichment and CCAP students have the same rights and responsibilities as all college students. Student privacy is protected under the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).
- 11. Attendance Responsibility**

Allan Hancock College does not track or report attendance for High School Enrichment or CCAP students.
- 12. Residency Requirement**

Students must live in and attend a high school or homeschool in Santa Barbara County or San Luis Obispo County.
- 13. Academic Expectations**

Students must complete all classwork. Students must maintain a 2.0 GPA or higher. Students must follow the Allan Hancock College Student Conduct Guidelines.
- 14. Academic Standing and Financial Aid**

Low grades or not completing classes may place students on academic probation. This may affect future financial aid eligibility.
- 15. College Environment and Parental Notification**

College classes are designed for adults and may include mature or sensitive topics. If a class ends early or is canceled, parents or guardians are not notified. The college is not responsible for students after class is dismissed.
- 16. Legal Requirement for High School Students**

California law requires principal or designee approval for high school students to enroll in college classes. Approval confirms the student is ready for college-level work. Instructors are not allowed to approve students for enrollment.
- 17. Receiving substandard grades and/or failure to complete course work may result in academic probation as well as affect future financial aid eligibility.**
- 18. Failure to Follow Rules**

Students who do not follow these rules may be dropped from their classes. Future participation in High School Enrichment or CCAP may be denied.
