I. Alignment of the Program with the AHC Mission

AHC Mission: Allan Hancock College provides quality educational opportunities that enhance student learning and the creative, intellectual, cultural, and economic vitality of our diverse community.

a. Have there been any changes that would require a change to your Program Mission?

The mission of the Administration of Justice (AJ) Program mirrors AHC's mission by enhancing all AJ students with a solid educational platform preparing them for either an Associate of Science degree, the pathway for those to transfer to a higher institution, and/or immediate employment in the Criminal Justice field. The AJ program specifically focusses on the fundamental processes of the criminal justice system coupled with the continual changing of our laws and societal dimensions.

The Administration of Justice program offers students two associate degree options:

1. Associate in Science for Transfer (AS-T) degree

The AS-T degree provides courses that enable students to complete lower division prerequisites and general education requirements to transfer to institutions of higher learning. The AS-T in Administration of Justice consists of two core courses (AJ 101 and AJ 103) and twelve units of course electives selected from a list of approved courses in Administration of Justice, for a total of eighteen units in the major and forty-five units of prescribed general education requirements.

2. Associate in Science (AS) degree.

The AS degree is considered a basic degree designed to meet limited employment hiring and promotion (in the career field) requirements. The AS in Administration of Justice consists of twenty-seven units in administration of justice and thirty-three units of general education requirements. There are five core courses for this degree: AJ101, AJ102, AJ103, AJ104 and AJ105 and twelve units of electives selected from a list of approved courses in the administration of justice discipline.

As such, the program has maintained an outstanding academic integrity, emphasizing numerous pathways, adhering to the purview of “Democracy’s College” for student success in obtaining a degree, college transfer and/or successful employment.

The Administration of Justice Program consistently ranks in the top five declared majors at this college and popular with the students. Careers in the Administration of Justice related field(s) continue to see growth and the projected employment outlook is above average even through this time of unrest in the country.

The Data demonstrates enrollment in the program has steadily increased; an overall retention rate percentage for the past 6 years of over 90%; and an overall success rate of over 85% with the 2019/2020 academic (2020-pandemic) year.






The Program is the top 5 disciplines listed at this institution and is continually growing with the recent transfer to the Public Services Section.



Q2_4 - The way this program meets your educational goals




Q2_5 - Contribution towards your intellectual growth

- d. Describe how the program works to promote student success (completions job placement, transfer). Include teaching innovations and use of academic and student support.

Careers in the administration of justice related fields continue to see tremendous growth, taking into account the current national stances. In the 2014-2015 assessment, the above question was formulated. Since then, the program has provided an enhanced learning environment such as:

1. Additional equipment and props for a realistic learning environment
2. Scenario based activities for the students to receive a hands-on type learning.
3. A \$600.00 grant was awarded to the program for supplies required to enhance the courses forensic(s) abilities.
4. An updated list of textbooks and interactive modes.
5. Agencies within the program (guest speakers) to provide recruitment tools for the students.
6. Instructional support for various programs within the discipline to enhance the marketability of each student.
7. Use of various college programs, such as the career center and LAP program to encourage awards and grants.
8. The introduction to the college's state-of-the-art training facility to promote job placement within the area.

The program has seen a steady increase in those students completing the basic requirements for the program, then transferring to a higher institution.





Historical Course Performance- This is SLO assessment by course, including percent and number of students that met standards.





I have shared my results with the Department chair. Please refer to section IV for the information.

- c. Did any of section, course or program improvement plans indicate that your program would benefit from specific resources in order to support student learning and/or faculty development? If so, please explain.

The Administration of Justice program is a constant developmental discipline. In order to properly provide the educational platform to the students, each instructor must update the material provided. The success of this program has been with the overall enthusiasm of the instructors. These instructors remain within the system, hence the updates mentioned are continuously completed.

During the inspection of the program, 3 courses were identified as not being selected for on-going instruction. Of those courses, one (1) course is being considered for instruction. The course in question is referenced as AJ305, Patrol Procedures, which is the study of the Police patrol system. This type of course is offered in other institutions. Note: This course remains active in the course outline eligibility.

In the Spring of 2019, the Department Chair retired and has not been replaced. A fulltime faculty member, assigned to the Santa Maria campus, within this discipline would provide a vital role with the tradition of this program and work to enhance, provide administrative functions and be the voice of the program for the students. Further, the faculty member would be able to assist in the growth of this program at the Lompoc campus.

Part of the assessment experience is to reach out to other institutions to understand their specifics on their program. Each facility I contacted has a unique feature which may be an asset for the college's success in this program. That is a pathway for the students to understand each class required for their specific experience. Here is an example:

- d. In reviewing your outcomes and assessments have you identified any and all that indicate a modification should be made to the course outline, the student learning outcomes or the program outcomes? Please state what modifications you will be making.

In 2009, the Administration of Justice program suffered resource losses in each category. Those losses were mentioned in the 2014-2015 program Review, however, funding, full-time faculty, support staff and improved technology were not addressed. Recently we secured an office space where the program can utilize space for course preparations and administrative functions.

- e. Have all course outlines been reviewed within the last 5 years? If not, please explain the plan to bring course outlines up to date and include timelines for the review and submission to AP&P.

The Administration of Justice has five core courses and several elected classes. During this evaluation, three courses have been identified, one course were specifically found to have been reviewed (2014-15 assessment) and updated for utilization as a viable course for students to consider. This course is in the process of being updated and if approved, will be brought into the student course list for the Fall/2021.


IV. Focus and Engagement of the Program

This fact may greatly hinder the programs steady popularity, but an alarming fact for the Spring 2021, recently noted the program was forced to reduce the number of available courses.


Q2_8 - The availability of courses offered in the AJ program


b. List any (internal or external) conditions that have influenced the program in the past year.


Q6_2 - I plan on taking additional courses in the AJ program
