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Labor Market Data

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

Largest Industries




One report generated from Lightcast data is the Economy Overview which can be generated for any US region. Key takeaways from the latest data for Santa Barbara and San Luis Obispo Counties are:

- As of 2023, the region's population declined by 1.0% since 2018, falling by 7,340.
 Population is expected to decrease by 2.9% between 2023 and 2028, resulting in a population decline of 20,710.
- From 2018 to 2023, jobs increased by 3.0% in both counties from 373,888 to 385,070. This change fell short of the national growth rate of 3.6% by 0.6%. As the number of jobs increased, the labor force participation rate increased from 59.8% to 62.2% between 2018 and 2023.
- Concerning educational attainment, 22.0% of the selected regions' residents possess a Bachelor's Degree (0.9% above the national average), and 9.2% hold an Associate's Degree (0.3% above the national average).
- The top three industries in 2023 are Restaurants and Other Eating Places, Education and Hospitals (Local Government), and Crop Production.

Population Trends





When the survey is completed AHC receives back student level data covering a variety of topics. This data are accessible via a Tableau dashboard on the IE website.



The star of the dashboard is wage data before and after attending AHC. This data can be disaggregated by gender, ethnicity, and student program of study.

The dashboard also contains the survey questions asked and all responses given are based on satisfaction and employment history.



The wage data above highlights that students of any demographic and in any program of study on average earn a higher wage after attending AHC.
