 - ➤ The section of POLS 103 that was assessed for Program Outcome #4 ["Explain the key concepts, terms, and processes involved in the study of political science."] had a "Meets Standards" rate of 79.5%
 - ➤ The section of POLS 104 that was assessed for Program Outcome #3 ["Evaluate the role of individuals and groups in the political process"] had a "Meets Standards" rate of 78.6%
- b. Please summarize your reflections, analysis, and interpretation of the learning outcome assessment and data.
 - ➤ The "Meets Standards" rates are consistent with the "Success Rates" and remain steady over time.
 - ➤ If adjusted for low participation rates versus low performance standards, the picture would look better.
 - ➤ The sample size for POLS 103 is larger than that for POLS 104.
 - POLS 104 has a higher percentage of POLS majors enrolled than POLS 103.





The *unsurprising* findings include:


- Like the college as a whole,
 - POLS headcount, enrollment and FTES were down over the five-year period from 2017-18 to 2021-22, with the latter coinciding with the global COVID-19 pandemic.

o POLS Online Traditional enrollments rose by roughly ten percentage points.



• POLS 103 continues to be the highest-enrolling course in the program, by a factor of more than 6 times the next highest, which is POLS 101.





• The ethnic make-up of the POLS program is consistent with that of the college overall, showing an increase in Hispanic enrollment and a corresponding drop in White enrollment.

Some of the more *interesting* findings over the five-year period include:

- POLS 104 had the most stable headcount in the program.
- POLS 103 had the highest efficiency in the program.
- The POLS headcount and enrollment dropped by a greater percentage than the college overall, but
 - POLS had a significantly higher efficiency rate than the college overall.


PROGRAM REVIEW: ENROLLMENT & HEADCOUNT






O POLS had a significantly higher fill rate than the college overall.

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 The success and retention rates for POLS courses offered in the "Synchronous Online" modality were high, and in fact, the only courses with "disproportionate impact" are "Online Traditional" and "Onsite". All "Online Synchronous" courses had success rates above 70%.




- The POLS program had a slight drop in both the success and retention rates.
- The POLS program had noticeably higher success and retention rates than the college overall.
- POLS Concurrent Enrollment courses have very high success and retention rates [see
 attached Excel document] perhaps as a result of a) high school is less optional than college,
 and; b) students [and parents] self-select into college-credit courses in high schools.
- The year with the highest success and retention rates for POLS was 2020-21, coinciding with the peak of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- POLS 104 and 105 success and retention rates where better during the "Zoom" [online synchronous] period than either before or after that time.
- POLS 101 and 103 success and retention rates remained relatively steady.



- The POLS program outperformed the college overall in persistence rates in
 - Every year for females, except Fall 2020, coinciding with peak, pre-vaccine COVID-19.
 - Three of the five years for males
- The only year that males had a higher persistence rate in POLS was Fall 2020, coinciding with peak, pre-vaccine COVID-19.

- 2. Based on the data analysis and looking through a lens of equity, what do you perceive as *challenges* with student success or access in your area of focus?
- ◆ The loss of "Online Synchronous" courses has removed an important option for students, reducing access to live courses without the burden of transportation time and costs.
- ♦ The loss of pre-college-level English and Writing courses negatively impacts first generation students, especially those living in non-English speaking households. This is particularly detrimental to those students enrolled in a reading- and writing-intensive course such as those in the POLS program.
- ♦ The trend of lower persistence rates for students who identify as male ought to be of concern to all.
- 3. What are your plans for change or *innovation*?
- ◆ Reinstate Online Synchronous and introduce Hybrid Online POLS courses
- Advocate for more robust support for student research and writing skills
- ♦ Offer the newly approved POLS 110 Political Theory every other spring, starting in 2024
- 4. How will you measure the results of your plans to determine if they are successful?
- ◆ Track Online Synchronous POLS enrollment, fill and success rates.
- ♦ Obtain data about writing support services for students.
- ◆ A first-time offering of POLS 110 would seem successful with an enrollment of close to 20.
