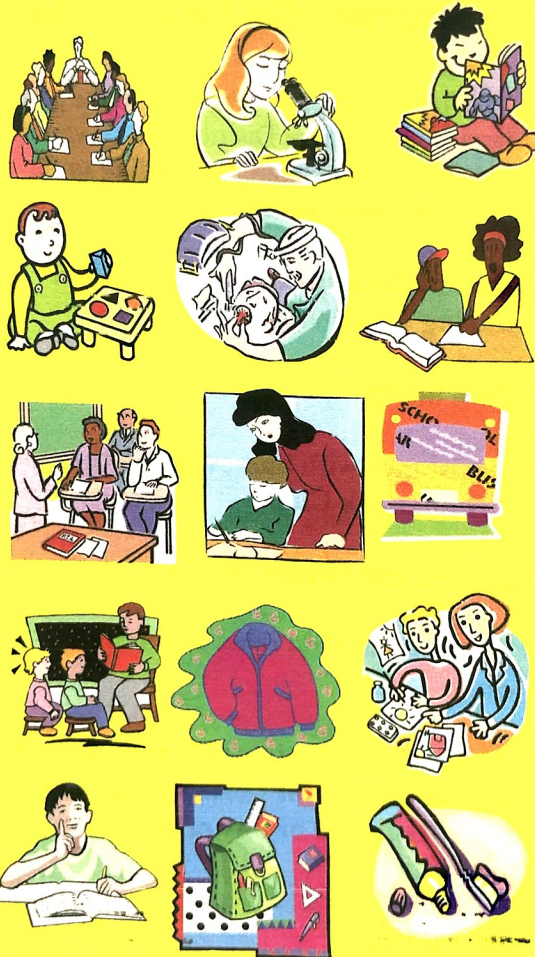

## What is the Migrant Education Program?

It is a federal program that provides supplemental education services and medical assistance in case of emergency to children throughout the United States. Each child that qualifies for the program has the right to receive these benefits according to individual needs of each student.

## How can my children qualify to the Migrant Education Program?

If you and your family have left Santa Maria recently or have been residing for less than 3 years and work or have worked in agriculture, fishing, livestock or poultry, your children may qualify for free services from the Migrant Education Program.

## How long can my child participate in the Migrant Education Program?

A Migrant family qualifies for 3 years. Your children can belong to the Migrant Education Program of the Santa Maria-Bonita School District until they finish their eight grade year, depending on how frequent you and your family leave the city for work related reasons.

## What services or benefits does the program offer for my children?

The Migrant Education Program of the Santa Maria-Bonita School District offers a variety of services for your children according to the individual needs of each child:
