- Residents: \$46 per unit
  - U.S. Citizens
  - Permanent Residents
- AB 540 students
- Immigration process with an I-130 or an I-485 form
- Seasonal Agricultural workers
- Nonresidents (International students& Nonresidents)
  - \$327 per unit + \$46 per unit= **\$373**

- Other costs to consider:
  - Parking
- Health fee

- Materials fees

OpenCCC is a service of the California Community Colleges Chancellors Office. The information in your account is kept private and secure.



# **CALIFORNIA DREAM ACT**


- The CA Dream Act is only for AB 540 students


