
Student Food Share

After a few conversations and some incredible work by faculty and administrators from both colleges, we are now ready to welcome our first cohort of pre-radiology students in Fall 2025, and SBCC will then offer their radiography program on the AHC campus in Fall 2026. 
Art Therapy Workshop






Chicano Art Exhibit


University Transfer Fair


Pride Center Grand Opening


AHC Foundation Scholarships


Hancock Hangout


Blood Drive






Tax Workshop




2025 Planning Retreat


CCPRO Conference & Awards


Culinary Grad Makes a Difference
