Steps to Enrollment

1

Complete the Online Admission Application

Go to www.hancockcollege.edu and select Apply to Hancock on the home page. You will be directed to the California Community College Online Application (Open CCCApply).

It is important that you complete BOTH steps:

1. Create a CCCApply account and receive a CCCID, and
2. Complete the application for admission for Allan Hancock College

To complete the application, you will need

- A copy of your high school transcript
- Your Social Security Number, if you have one
- An email address

After completing the application for admission, two emails will be sent to the address you provide on your application:

- One is from CCCApply containing that username and CCCApply ID and
- One from AHC containing your AHC student ID number (H#) and your myHancock username and password

You will need this information to register for classes.

Note: If you completed prerequisite work at another college/university or you plan to obtain an associate degree or a certificate, you must submit official transcripts to the Admissions & Records office before registering for classes or applying for your degree or certificate. If you have completed Advanced Placement (AP) testing, be sure to send official test scores to the Admissions & Records office.

Apply for Financial Aid

Now more than ever, don't let a lack of money get in the way of your college education. Financial aid is available year-round to help cover college costs like tuition, books, supplies, and sometimes, even rent. There are many different types of financial aid such as grants and scholarships (which you do not have to pay back), and loans. The first step is to apply—even if you aren't sure you will qualify.

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) (www.fafsa.gov) is available every year on October 1. For undocumented, Dream Act-eligible students, the California Dream Act Application (CADAA) (<https://dream.csac.ca.gov>) is your first step to receiving financial aid. Apply as soon as you can and before the March 2 Cal Grant deadline to get the most financial aid possible.

For assistance applying for financial aid, the Financial Aid office is open via phone, email, online chat, and in-person services in bldg. A on the Santa Maria campus and at the Lompoc Valley Center. If you wish to "see" your financial aid representative via video-conferencing, you are able to do so by using Cranium Café at hancockcollege.craniumcafe.com. Complete the Online Orientation

All new students are required to complete the online orientation. You will learn about student support services, college success tips, and other important "need to know" information. Check Your English and Math Placement

Your English and math skills will be assessed based on your high school and/or official college transcripts as reported to the college via CCCApply or through previous courses taken at an accredited institution. You may view your placement by logging into your myHancock portal and selecting "English and Math Placement" under the "Registration" tab. If you feel your past performance in math and English does not reflect your academic ability, contact an AHC counselor to see what the best option for placement is for you. - 1 Visit www.hancockcollege.edu and select **Search Classes** on the home page.
- 2 Select **Winter** or **Spring** and click the **Select a Term** button.
- 3 Select **Credit** and click the **Select Class Type** button
- 4 Click **Submit** at the bottom of the screen.
- 5 Each class is identified with a 5-digit number called the **CRN**. Click the blue **CRN** number for additional class details.
- 6 **Building/Room** indicates the method of instruction for your class.

- O** **ONLINE-DL:** Learn online with no scheduled meeting times.
- R** **REMOTE ERT (Zoom):** Attend virtually via Zoom during scheduled meeting times
- C** **Classroom:** Meet regularly on-campus in a safe, socially-distanced setting
- H** **Hybrid:** Participate in a combination of Online, Classroom, and Remote-ERT formats

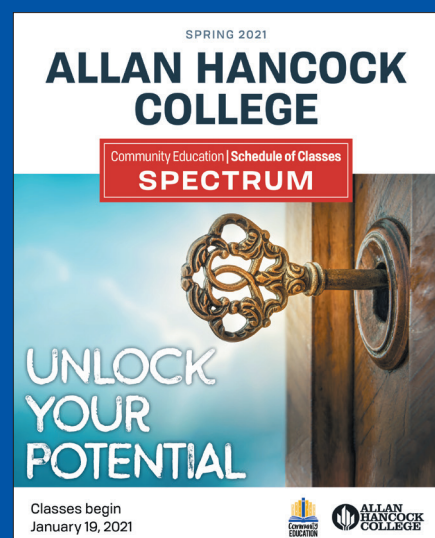

Concurrent Enrollment Spring 2021

High school students! You can jump start your college education now!

Allan Hancock College offers its concurrent enrollment program through area high schools allowing students to simultaneously receive high school and college credit by completing classes offered through your high school taught by college-approved faculty. Classes are free. In order to participate, students must have a minimum 2.5 unweighted high school grade point average.
