6. President's Remarks (Allegre)

Announcements: Program Review Annual Updates are in process and the new form is being used. As this is a new form and there are a few glitches, the deadline to submit the form has been extended. Departments are encouraged to send feedback to P. McGuire on the utility of the form.

College Council is seeking donations so that wine can be served during the Retirements and Recognitions Ceremony on May 15. Donations go into the Retirees Scholarship Fund and are tax deductible. There will also be a jar at the event for attendees to contribute.

As yet, there is no announcement regarding the hiring of a new VP of Academic Affairs.

The document generated at the 2018 Planning Retreat "Changing the Odds at Allan Hancock College: Guiding Principles and Priorities to Lead College Planning" is out (distributed via email and posted on Senate website on 4/19/2018.) This list of Guiding Principles and Priority Initiatives and Strategies will help drive prioritization of resource requests in the fall. Senators should share it with department faculty.

7. Concurrent Enrollment

Tom Lamica provided an update on Concurrent Enrollment and the plans for the program. The program began in Fall of 2015 and has grown rapidly. For 2017-2018 we offered 97 sections at 9 local high schools and enrolled over 2600 students. The number of sections requested for 2018-2019 is even larger. The program is seeking accreditation with the National Alliance of Concurrent Enrollment Partnerships (NACEP) which requires that it meet 16 standards designed to ensure that courses are comparable to those offered on campus and appropriate oversight is present to ensure course integrity. In order to apply for accreditation as soon as we are eligible (when our program has been operational for 5 consecutive years), the 16 standards must be in place by the end of next school year.

8. Update on Spring Plenary

AB705 and California's new online college dominated discussion at the 2018 Spring Plenary of ASCCC. The session was marked by friction between the Chancellor's Office and the state Academic Senate which has traditionally operated on a basis of consultation and collaboration. While the Governor and Chancellor's Office are pursuing AB705 and Online College "full speed ahead," ASCCC approved resolutions challenging both.

The list of approved resolutions should be available at the website (asccc.org) soon.

9. LOAC Professional Development

LOAC wants to offer professional development activities and seeks faculty input on content areas and scheduling. Two areas of focus are (1) assessment development/rubric development/eLumen and (2) "closing the loop" between plans for improving classes and measuring the success of those plans. Possible times for ongoing professional development include Fridays, alternate Tuesdays (when Senate does not meet). LOAC (specifically, Liz West) invites more suggestions.

10. AP7211 Minimum Qualifications and Equivalency

Changes in this AP are being recommended by the Professional Standards Committee. Most are aimed

at clarifying/ "cleaning up" the requirements for Equivalencies to Minimum Qualifications for instructors. This AP will be an action item at the next Senate meeting.
