**Comparisons and contrasts clarify a situation** 

by pointing out similarities and differences.

**Comparing**: to point out similarities

Contrasting: to point out differences.

#### **ORGANIZATION**

Let us contrast the usefulness of a motorcycle with that of an automobile.

We will base our contrast on expense, upkeep, and safety.
