MLA Format: Titles of Texts

In general, shorter works are placed in quotation marks while longer works are italicized. Here is a guide to common types of texts:

Titles in Quotation Marks		Titles in Italics	
Chapters:	"A New Life"	Books:	Breaking Through
Articles:	"The Future of Clean Energy"	News Sources:	The Washington Post
Page on a Web	site: "Human Rights" on the United Nations website.	Websites:	<i>Google</i> or <i>YouTube</i>
Songs:	"Dreams" by Fleetwood Mac	Albums:	1989 (Taylor's Version)
Poems:	"Harlem" by Langston Hughes	Plays:	Twelfth Night or Hamlet
TV Episodes:	"The One with the Monkey"	TV Shows/ Films:	Friends or Finding Nemo
Short Stories:	"Girl" by Jamaica Kincaid	Works of Art:	The Starry Night

Note: Titles should be written in **Title Case (standard capitalization)** and not in all capital letters. Also, unless they are at the beginning of the title, articles (such as "of", "the", "and", etc.) should not be capitalized.
